8/11/17	ISFAA Financial Aid/FAFSA programs	<p>The local Financial Aid/ <u>FAFSA info programs will be on Wednesday, November 1, 2017 and on Tuesday, January 23, 2018.</u> Both presentations will again be at 6:30pm at Ivy Tech Community College's Ivy Hall auditorium, and both Ivy-Tech and Purdue staff will be on hand to present and answer questions.</p> <p>The programs are for any students who plan to attend college in the fall of 2018, and any of their family members. The November and January presentations will be the same and will cover general financial aid information and processes (Interest in attending or admittance to either Ivy-Tech or Purdue isn't required to attend). The first program will be just before the first College Goal Sunday FAFSA filing event. Hopefully that should be good timing for anyone totally new to the whole financial aid process.</p> <p>College Goal Sunday This is the 2nd year that the FAFSA will look two years back at income info, so continue to tell your students/families they <u>should not</u> feel rushed to complete their FAFSA in early October. Most Indiana colleges <u>have not</u> changed their priority FAFSA filing dates and the State of Indiana actually <u>has extended</u> its annual FAFSA filing deadline to April 15th (no longer March 10th).</p> <p>Although the state College Goal Sunday website http://www.collegegoalsunday.org/ hasn't been updated yet, there will again be two CGS events to help families with filing the 2018-19 FAFSA. 		<p>NOTE: After the security issues in the spring, the Feds say that the IRS Data Retrieval Tool will be back up and running on October 1st. The 2018-19 FAFSA will collect 2016 tax information, so most students/families should be able to use the IRS-DRT to transfer their already completed 2016 tax info directly into the FAFSA.</p> <p>**One step that families should do ahead of filing the FAFSA is to create the Federal Student Aid ID, FSA-ID (one for the student-one for a parent) by going to www.fafsa.gov/ and clicking the FSA-ID icon at the top.</p>
